





Lion Box

	<p>To start off, you will need: an Easter egg box (or any kind of cardboard box - like a cereal box); some paper; crayons; tape/glue.</p> <p>Then decide which animal you would like to turn your box into -we will be making a lion.</p>
	<p>Colour in four pieces of paper using a yellow crayon. If you don't have crayons you could use felt tip pens or paint.</p>
	<p>Using scissors and sticky tape (or glue), stick the yellow paper to the sides of your box.</p>
	<p>If your box has a hole on the front, make a hole in the piece of paper that covers this side. You might need a grown up to help you with this bit. This will be the nose of your lion. If your box doesn't have a hole, you could either make one, or just draw the nose on later.</p>



Colour a piece of paper using a black crayon (or felt tip or paint). Scrunch it up a little bit and push it through the hole in your box, from the inside. Use some tape to hold the black paper in place, from the inside of the box. This part is a bit fiddly!



Use a mug to draw a circle on a new piece of paper. Carefully cut this circle out - you might need a grown up to help you. Then draw the shape of the mane of the lion around the edge of the paper, and cut around this shape. Colour it in brown crayon.



Stick the mane onto the box using glue or tape (glue might be easier). Leave enough space around the nose to draw on the lion's face.



Using pencil, draw your lion's face. He will need eyes, a smile, and whiskers! When you are happy with it, go over the face in pen or a thick crayon.

You now have a lion!
